
How the Plan has been developed?

- Initial discussions at Parish Council meeting with public presentation from Dorset Resilience Forum.
- Steering group of councillors and volunteers established.
- Village questionnaire.
- Guidance from Dorset and other community examples used to form draft plan.
- Core group of coordinators and key volunteers established to deliver the Plan.



Personal Safety

- Emergency Grab Bag recommended.




Risks that Iwerne Minster might encounter

Role of Community Emergency Coordination Team

- Share any information received in the event of prolonged outages e.g. power/water.
- Mobilising community volunteer support, e.g. snow patrol.
- Liaison with utility providers.
- Work with emergency services providing voluntary support.
- Support for vulnerable residents.
- Providing information updates WhatsApp, notice boards, etc.

- Emergency equipment, e.g. walkie talkies, torches etc.
- Information pack for coordinators.
