Abingdon Hall report for 2025

A lot has been achieved this year. Most of which has to be credited to our secretary Rita Lishman.

After a lot of discussions with the planning office and help from Hazel Marsh a work specification for retiling the hall roof was sent out to three contractors. The committee agreed to accept the quote from Kavanagh's and despite the bad weather they completed the work quickly and efficiently.

A workshop about creating a website was held at a meeting that Rita and I attended. The cost would be £11.99 for the domain name and because we are a Charity there would be no charge for the website which we could design and maintain ourselves. Rita has set this up and it is running smoothly.

At another meeting we attended we heard a talk by a member of the fire brigade and it soon became apparent that the hall was not complying with Government guidelines. Four of the committee members met to examine in detail what was needed to bring the hall up to a legal standard. We identified three items that needed instant attention. One was the fact that the seats on the chairs were not fire retardant, so they have all been sprayed another was the fire exit signs were not adequate so they have been replaced with illuminous fire signs and lastly we have informed all hirers that the front doors need to be unbolted at all times. Rita has produced a Fire Risk Assessment document which will be reviewed yearly. We have also had all portable appliances PAT tested and a comprehensive electrical inspection has been completed. We are planning to put in place emergency lighting in the main hall and the toilet.

Wessex Internet installed our internet connection at the reduced rate that they offered when they were doing their sales meetings and it is working well.

The needlework project is going well and the ladies are holding a coffee morning on the 24th May to raise money towards mounting the tapestry. The original artwork is to be displayed in the kitchen area.

Village Open Gardens is taking place on the 28th and 29th June as a joint project between the Hall and the Village Club which will hopefully bring in much needed funds.

Unfortunately Rita is retiring as our secretary and it is proving difficult to find a replacement. She has left everything running smoothly so hopefully someone will come forward to replace her.
